As we celebrate our 50th anniversary, we remember the past while looking forward to the future, where we will continue to make a difference in the communities where we live and work.

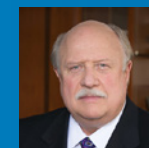

Our Albuquerque office opens with four attorneys to serve the needs of clients doing work in New Mexico.

1968

Firm Founded

After graduating from the University of Colorado's law school, childhood friends Norm Brownstein, Steve Farber and Jack Hyatt open the doors of Brownstein Hyatt & Farber. From day one, the founders utilized their legal acumen, networking and community-building skills to grow their firm.

1987

Powerbrokers

The *Rocky Mountain News* describes Norm Brownstein and Steve Farber as "Powerbrokers" for the first time based on their influence and work on political and business fronts in Denver.

1988

Firm Name Change

The firm's name changes to Brownstein Hyatt Farber & Madden.

1991

Firm Name Change

The firm's name changes to Brownstein Hyatt Farber & Strickland. Tom Strickland was with the firm until 1998, when he was appointed U.S. Attorney by President Bill Clinton and the firm's name returned to Brownstein Hyatt & Farber.

1995

DC Office Opens

Building off Norm Brownstein and the firm's advocacy efforts around the U.S.-Israel relationship, the firm opens an office in Washington, D.C., starting out with a cramped office space, a few employees and one client.

1999

Record Charitable Giving

The firm's annual charitable giving exceeds \$500,000 for the first time.

2002

Mark F. Leonard Scholarship Program

The firm establishes the Mark F. Leonard Scholarship Program, a four-year scholarship awarded to a staff member's child each year.

2003

JUNE Bruce James Named Managing Partner

Bruce James is named managing partner of the firm. Previously, Jack Hyatt served as managing partner until 1991 and from 1991–2003, the firm had a committee-based management structure.

2007

Merger with Schreck Brignone

The firm merges with the Las Vegas-based law firm of Schreck Brignone to become Brownstein Hyatt Farber Schreck. Led by Frank Schreck, the firm brought a notable list of high-profile gaming clients with it.

2008

JANUARY Merger with Hatch & Parent

The firm merges with California law firm Hatch & Parent creating one of the largest water practices in the country and adding five offices in California.

HELP of Southern Nevada

Brownstein has provided pro bono legal services for HELP of Southern Nevada, helping them develop the Shannon West Homeless Youth Center in Las Vegas. The team worked more than 400 hours over the course of almost three years with the acquisition, construction and financing of the center. Angela Otto, real estate shareholder, led the team and was honored by HELP of Southern Nevada for her pro bono work for the center, which opened in July. HELP of Southern Nevada serves more than 103,000 clients each year, providing assistance to low-income families, homeless teens and adults, among other individuals, helping them to become self-sufficient through direct services, trainings and referrals.

Kids in Need of Defense

Children in immigration court, including those who came to the United States unaccompanied, have no right to counsel. Kids in Need of Defense is helping to bridge this gap by providing referrals to pro bono attorneys for minors in removal proceedings. Through this program, a team of Brownstein attorneys succeeded in getting asylum for a teenage girl from El Salvador. The case lasted over a year and involved three appearances in Los Angeles immigration court, preparation of numerous declarations and filings, assembly of expert evidence, multiple interviews with the client and family members and translation of court documents from El Salvador.

Project Worthmore

Brownstein attorneys partnered with Project Worthmore to provide advice and counsel regarding the Green Card application process to refugee families. Our team trained multiple volunteer attorneys in the naturalization process and hosted a clinic at the firm's Denver office. Project Worthmore aims to improve the quality of life for Denver-area refugees by providing cultural mentorship and community supports, ranging from service opportunities to legal clinics such as the one hosted at the firm.
